For the guidance of the Thomasian community, the UST Committee on Negotiations with telecommunications companies (Telcos) provided initial negotiation updates on 30 April 2020.

Below is a summary of recommendations from the UST TASK FORCE VERITAS, approved by the Acting Rector, Rev. Fr. Richard G. Ang, O.P.:

Provision of pre-termination clause in case of unsatisfactory service during the 1st month of subscription;</li> <li>b. Provision in the Telcos page of the list of locations/areas where their services are available;</li> <li>c. Provision of hotspots based on number of subscribers and quality of signal;</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	Effective immediately
	<ul> <li>4. Implementation of the initiative will begin immediately to cover the remaining part of the 2<sup>nd</sup> term, AY 2019-20, in order to: <ul> <li>a. Provide relief to students, if only during the last 3 weeks that they try to cope with coursework, and particularly during the final examinations/final assessment period.</li> <li>b. Support UST's previous commitment to work out possible student-friendly schemes with the Telcos;</li> <li>c. Enjoy the advantages of being among the earlier partner institutions of Telcos, since many other HEIs have already begun their own negotiations with them (e.g. DLSU, TIP);</li> <li>d. Have basis for further improvements as UST prepares for the new normal this coming AY 2020-21.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>	
	5. Allow the Committee, led by Dean Marcelo, to take charge of the details of its implementation, <u>subject to and consistent</u> with University policies. Such details may include, but are not limited to, the following:  a. Seeking the best possible promo plan that students may avail of, e.g. freebies for students vis-à-vis number of	

subscribers;

- b. Coordinating with the UST legal counsel for the applicable MOA between UST and the Telcos;
- c. Conducting an orientation with student leaders to:
  - Set realistic expectations;
  - Explain clearly the possible advantages, as well as disadvantages, of the package, if any;
  - Address directly students' queries and clarifications.
- d. Preparing related communications such as announcements for students;
- e. Coordinating with other academic or administrative units on any related matter.
- 6. Academic units can submit a list of students who can be prioritized, particularly those that have been identified to have no internet access at all.

The Committee shall continue with its initiatives and come up with a long-term plan/proposal to improve the technical aspects of online learning in the University as well as address issues related to the Data Privacy Act.
