Conference Overview:

The Philippine Professional Standards for Teachers (PPST) articulates a set of standards that makes explicit what teachers should know, be able to do and value to achieve competence, improved student learning outcomes, and eventually quality education (PPST 2017, p.4). With the exception of the word 'expect' the articulation of what teachers should know, be able to do and value echo the exact words of the Australian College Educators National statement in 2003. What teachers should know and do are within the terrain of functional competence while value puts premium on personal identity (Walkington, 2010, p.54).

Recognizing the importance of achieving both functional competence and personal identity, this conference seeks to start a powerful conversation that will influence those who are charged with the training and formation of future teachers to transition from supervision to mentoring thereby paving the way for both the development of functional competence but also the long term professional identity of these future teachers (Walkington, 2010, p. 56).
