The Catechism of the Catholic Church (cf. nos. 490-491) states that "to become the mother of the Savior, Mary 'was enriched by God with gifts appropriate to such a role.'¹ The angel Gabriel at the moment of the annunciation salutes her as 'full of grace' (*Lk* 1:28). In fact, in order for Mary to be able to give the free assent of her faith to the announcement of her vocation, it was necessary that she be wholly borne by God's grace." In 1854, Pope Pius IX proclaimed the Dogma of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary.²

The University, through the Office of the Vice-Rector for Religious Affairs and the Center for Campus Ministry, and the Santísimo Rosario Parish-UST will celebrate the following Masses in honor of the **Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary**, *Principal Patroness of the Philippines*, and of the *Archdiocese of Manila*:

- 1. **December 7** (Tuesday) | **4:00 pm** *Institutional Mass for the Vigil of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary*
- 2. **December 8** (Wednesday) | **7:30 am; 9:00 am; 4:00 pm** and **5:30 pm** *Masses in honor of the Immaculate Conception of the Blessed Virgin Mary*

The Masses will be live-streamed through the official Facebook pages of the University (UST1611official) and the Parish (SantisimoRosarioUST).

Furthermore, on 8 December 2021, the *Dominican Province of the Philippines* celebrates its 50th Foundation Anniversary. We likewise recall on this day, the Reconsecration of the Altar of the Santísimo Rosario Parish Church twenty-two years ago. In the Universal Church, December 8, this year, marks the conclusion of the Year of Saint Joseph.

For those who will virtually participate: The Masses will be live-streamed through the official Facebook pages of the University (UST1611official) and the Parish (SantisimoRosarioUST).

For those who will physically attend: All Thomasians and parishioners are enjoined to observe the basic health protocol against the COVID-19 virus, and the directives of the University, the City of Manila and the Inter-Agency Task Force for the Management of Emerging Infectious Diseases (IATF).

December 8 is officially declared as a special non-working holiday³ in the Philippines, and has been observed as a NO-CLASS, NO WORK DAY by the University to provide the members of the Thomasian community the opportunity to observe this **holy day** of obligation⁴ for the Catholic faithful.
