RE : CLARIFICATION CONCERNING EID'L FITR

DATE : 2 May 2022

Devout Muslims fast every day for about 30 days from dawn to sunset during the entire Ramadan, the holy month of fasting, which is a period of introspection, communal prayer ( $\underline{salat}$ ) in the mosque, and the reading of the  $Qur'\bar{a}n$ , Islam's holy book. **Eid'1 Fitr**, the *Festival of the Breaking of the Fast*, marks the end of Ramadan, and is traditionally celebrated by Muslim families gathering in large congregation for an Eid prayer to express gratitude to Allah for having been able to perform their personal sacrifices.  $^1$  Eid celebrations depend on when the new moon is sighted by local religious authorities.  $^2$ 

As Malacañang Palace declared May 3 as *regular holiday*<sup>3</sup>, **classes in all levels and office work in the University will be suspended on <u>3 May 2022</u> (Tuesday) in solidarity with the national observance<sup>4</sup> of the annual celebration of <b>Eid'1 Fitr**.

However, the **Leadership Training Webinar for the University administrators** will push through as scheduled.

May peace, patience, and understanding prevail! *Eid Mubarak* (Blessed Eid) to our Muslim brothers and sisters!
