ACADEMICIAN MARIBEL G. NONATO, Ph.D.

As an instructional leader, Dr. Nonato taught *Organic Chemistry* at the UST College of Science and *Chemistry of Natural Products* at UST Graduate School until her retirement

Together with her mentors, Professor Emeritus Beatrice Q. Guevara and Prof. Alicia M. Aguinaldo, she helped propel UST as one of the leading Philippine Higher Education Institutions in the field of Natural Products Chemistry.

As a researcher, she has an H-index of 17 (with 58 papers cited in Google Scholar. The paper she published in 2011 in the Journal of Natural Medicines, focusing on the bioactive metabolites of *Diaporthe sp. P133*, stood out as the most referenced article, accumulating 69 citations.

As an administrator, she

- a) organized the transfer from the old UST Research Center in the UST Hospital to the Thomas Aquinas Research Complex;
- b) supported the expansion of research areas of the Research Center for the Natural Sciences;
- c) led the UST College of Science, as its dean, in attaining its PACUCOA Level IV Accreditation, the first in the University;
- d) came up with policies and programs which helped maintain the position of the College of Science as a research-intensive academic unit;
- e) formulated the Thomasian Research Excellence and Engagements (TREE) program with priority areas in Capability, Integrity, Grants, Dissemination and Linkages, Mentoring, Linkages, Management, Excellence Framework, Incentives;
- f) facilitated the establishment of the Research Center for Culture, Arts and Humanities;
- g) expanded the research clusters of UST to include Sacred Sciences, Science and Technology, Health Sciences, Education and Social Sciences, Arts and Humanities;
- h) introduced the categorization of researchers into three (3) tiers (To recognize, establish, and lead researchers); and
- i) assisted the Rector in leading, planning, managing, implementing, monitoring and evaluating policies, processes and procedures for the operation of UST General Santos Integrated Innovation Agri-Technology Campus.

PROF. LILIAN J. SISON, Ph.D.

As the Dean of the UST Graduate School (2000-2013), Prof. Sison led the

- a) restructuring of the Curriculum to make the Programs more research intensive with the introduction of a mandatory course in Research Colloquium for those with theses and dissertations. Students were also encouraged to seek opportunities for research attachment and presentations in international conferences and research forums.
- b) expansion of graduate program offerings to include Master's Program in Cultural Heritage Studies, Food Science, Health Professions and Rehabilitation Science;
- c) establishment of three (3) extension centers of the Graduate School: Psychotrauma Clinic in 2002, Center for the Conservation of Cultural Property and Environment in the Tropics (CCCPET) in 2003; and Center for Continuing Professional Education and Development (CCPED).
- d) Masters program accreditation by PACUCOA, from Level I accreditation status to 2nd reaccreditation to Level III;
- e) supervision of the renovation and the transfer of the UST Graduate School from the Junior High School Building to its more dignified place at the Thomas Aquinas Research Complex;
- f) provision of Extension Service to CHED and DOST -SEI by offering Non-thesis Master's programs to CHED Faculty scholars teaching General Education subjects. The Graduate School also served as a training center for DOST SEI scholars (DepED teachers of Math and Science assigned in Region IV-A);
- g) delivery of the Master's Program in Rehabilitation Science in partnership with the University of South Australia. Twelve (12) academic staff of the College of Rehabilitation Science completed their Master's degree under this program, significantly improving the Faculty profile of the College.;
- h) expansion of graduate students' activities to include sports, internationalization, and *agape*;
- i) organization and hosting of International Conferences; and
- j) committee that prepared the feasibility study of the UST Santa Rosa campus in Laguna.
