

UST@414: Keep us in Beauty

The Pontifical and Royal **University of Santo Tomas**, The Catholic University of the Philippines, in celebrating its remarkable 414-year legacy, embraces the theme “*Keep Us in Beauty*”—a profound reflection of its enduring commitment to nurturing both intellect and spirit. Far beyond aesthetics, this theme affirms UST’s belief that *beauty is a transformative force*—one that shapes character, inspires action, and fosters meaningful contributions to society.

Rooted in classical philosophy and Christian theology, Our Patron, **St. Thomas Aquinas**, offers a timeless understanding of beauty, one that resonates deeply with UST’s mission. The Angelic Doctor teaches that beauty is intrinsically linked to **truth and goodness and love**, and defines it through three essential qualities: (1) **Integritas** (*Wholeness*)—Beauty requires completeness; nothing essential should be missing or broken; (2) **Consonantia** (*Harmony*)—Beauty exists in proper proportion and order, where all parts relate meaningfully to the whole; and **Claritas** (*Radiance*)—The most profound element, this refers to the way something shines with intelligibility, appealing not just to the senses but to the intellect, reflecting deeper truths.

The beauty of Thomasians is reflected in the way they carry themselves—with confidence, grace, and dignity shaped by their values and education. Thomasians are beautiful not simply in appearance, but in the way they embody wholeness, harmony, and radiance in daily life. They manifest beauty when they act with *integrity*, when their lives reflect a *balanced integration* of knowledge, faith, and compassion, and when they *radiate* truth and goodness in service to others.

St. Thomas Aquinas also writes, “*Pulchra dicuntur quae visa placent*”—“Beautiful things are those which, when seen, please” (*S.Th. I, q. 5, a. 4, ad 1*). Beauty, then, is not merely subjective; it must possess objective qualities that resonate with both heart and reason. This understanding of beauty is most fully revealed in Our Lord Jesus Christ. As the Gospel of John proclaims: “And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we have seen His glory, the glory as of the only Son from the Father, full of grace and truth” (*Jn 1:14*). In Christ, beauty is the radiant manifestation of divine truth, grace, and love.

Thomasians reflect this beauty when they live with purpose—impelled by faith, propelled by hope, and compelled by love (*1 Cor 13:13*). Whether in the classroom, the laboratory, the library, in the field, the workplace, or the farthest reaches of mission, Thomasians serve with competence, act with unwavering commitment, and extend compassion to where it is most needed.

To “*Keep Us in Beauty*” is, therefore, a call to remain in Christ—the Source of all beauty—and to continue living out the ideals of UST in ways that are both intellectually profound and spiritually illuminating. It is a reminder that every Thomasian holds the potential to make the world more beautiful by being whole, harmonious, and radiant—grounded in *Truth in Charity* (cf. Eph 4:15).






